Over the first four bars of the progression I have applied a great jazz blues chord substitutions called tritone or b5 substitution in beat 4 of bar 1 and beat 3 of bar 4. I added a ii^\ominus chord in bar 4 to fill out the space, but decided to only use the dominant chord in bar 1 because it only lasts one measure.
